Light up Windsor Street Fair

The Hawkesbury's favourite annual Christmas celebration, Light Up Windsor Street Fair returns!

From **5pm to 9pm on Saturday 30 November, Windsor Mall and George Street** will burst to life with Christmas cheer, including dozens of market stalls, snow flurries, Christmas lights, free face painting, and live entertainment.

If you're a business along George Street, this is a great opportunity to increase foot traffic as the streets are closed and we're expecting around 15,000 people from the Hawkesbury and surrounds to be there.







September's resident local spending had a decline in *Grocery Stores & Supermarkets, Professional Services, Dining & Entertainment*, and *Transport*, however increased in the *Specialised & Luxury Goods* category.

Meanwhile, September's visitor local spending had a decline in *Grocery Stores & Supermarkets, Specialised & Luxury Goods*, and *Transport*, however increased in the *Professional Services*, and *Dining & Entertainment* categories.









<u>Spendmapp</u>, developed by Geografia, is an economic modelling tool used by several local government areas to measure consumer spending of locals and visitors geographically using bank data.

The tool helps local Council's and businesses gain a better understanding of the local economy by providing an insight into the visitor economy, online expenditure and escape expenditure. Using the data helps determine patterns of spending and can assist with managing and responding to long term economic trends and shocks.

New workplace laws and requirements for small businesses

Small businesses who employ more than fifteen (15) staff now have new obligations involving the right for employees to disconnect and a new pathway for casuals to convert to permanent employment, with more requirements for smaller employers next year. These requirements involve:

• Unfair contracts – Independent contractors will be able to apply for their services contracts to be cancelled or changed if the terms are found to be unfair.

- Right to disconnect Employees will now have the right to decline monitoring, reading, or responding to attempted contact outside of their working hours, unless it is deemed unreasonable to do so.
- Casual employees A new pathway for eligible casual employees to request change to permanent employment.
- Definition of employment New information on how an employment relationship is determined for the purposes of the Fair Work Act.

Plastics bans and packaged food and drinks

From 1 January 2025 you can no longer supply banned plastic items as part of packaged food and drinks. Commonly called "integrated packaging" these are plastic items that have been packaged through a machine-automated process and are:

- inside or attached to packaging material used to seal or contain food or beverages (including pre-packaged portions of food or beverages)
- an integrated part of packaging material used to seal or contain food or beverages

Anyone affected by the upcoming bans should begin the process of transitioning away from supplying banned plastic items integrated into food and beverage packaging as soon as possible. Distributors, retailers and other suppliers are encouraged to:

- Conduct stocktakes of affected products.
- Ensure you can exhaust your stocks of affected items before 1 January 2025.
- Inform your product buyers and customers of the upcoming ban and ensure they can exhaust any affected stock purchased before 1 January 2025.
- Share this information with suppliers, importers, and other relevant parts of your supply chain.

Important notice for all food businesses

Council's Environmental Health Officers would like to remind all retail food businesses and caterers to ensure they meet new mandatory food safety requirements in the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code (Food Standard 3.2.2A). The deadline to meet the new Standard is **8 December 2024.**

The three areas where the Food Standard has changed include the following:

- 1. Nearly all businesses (including children's services) are now required to have a Food Safety Supervisor (FSS).
- 2. The requirement for all staff to have adequate skills and knowledge has been strengthened. Free training now provided.
- 3. Showing food is safe through clear written instructions and/or record keeping for critical processes.

If you already have an FSS, you will only need to ensure other staff who handle unpackaged, potentially hazardous food have appropriate skills and knowledge in food safety and hygiene. Higher risk businesses must also be able to show they are managing food safety risks. Given that the internet training is free, it's considered reasonable that all staff should undertake this.

These new requirements do not apply to the handling or sale of food for fundraising solely for community or charitable causes, providing food free to the community, or businesses licensed with the NSW Food Authority.

NSW Food Authority is offering free training in order to assist businesses in complying with the Standard. The Food Handler Basics Training can be accessed, and other information is available on Council's <u>website</u> Search for "food" at <u>www.hawkesbury.nsw.gov.au</u>

If you would like to further discuss these changes and how they may affect your business, you should call Council and ask to speak with an Environmental Health Officer.
