

BARELY WEARABLE | RUTH DOWNES

Barely Wearable continues **Ruth Downes'** passion for reappropriating everyday materials and objects to celebrate their intrinsic beauty. Materials for these 'wearable' artworks have been gleaned from a diverse range of sources – from aircraft headsets to coffee capsules. Detritus from nature has also been salvaged to be re-born as a fashion statement.

By reimagining these materials, **Downes'** has created works that transcend their utilitarian function, casting them in a fresh light. The works question our accepted values and how we award status by projecting these everyday materials into the realm of art.


SUNDAY 16 MARCH, 1-3 PM

BRIDGING THE HAWKESBURY RIVER/ DYARUBBIN: THE HISTORY OF WINDSOR BRIDGE

OPENING SATURDAY 8 MARCH

Windsor Bridge was the oldest, existing bridge crossing the Dyarubbin (Hawkesbury River). Sensationally opened in 1874, it was cited as an engineering marvel. This new exhibition explores the history and significant of this bridge, the engineering feat and expertise utilised during its construction and the communities fight to save it.

Bridging the Hawkesbury River/Dyarubbin: The History of Windsor Bridge features never before seen images and original objects from the bridge shown for the first time.

BANGADYI NAWI -BUILDING A CANOE

The Nawi is a traditional canoe and a living artifact made by local Aboriginal high school students during an inter-generational camp facilitated by and held at Brewongle Environmental Education Centre. **Bangadyi Nawi** engaged respectfully with the community and will continue to shape learning opportunities for the whole community.

The **Bangadyi Nawi** project won the 2024 Leo Kelly OAM Arts and Culture Award from Local Government NSW and the 2023 IMAGinE Award for Engagement Programs.

11 STORIES FROM THE RIVER DYARUBBIN

ON DISPLAY NOW

Hear stories about the river's formation, Aboriginal culture, colonial settlers, historic floods, farming, boats, recreation, and ecology, from deep time to the very present; with over 80 contributors from the wider Hawkesbury area. Accompanying the exhibition are 11 audio walks located along the banks of the Hawkesbury River between Yarramundi and Sackville, developed by composer and sound designer **Oonagh Sherrard** in partnership with the **Hawkesbury Regional Museum**.

The **11 Stories From the River Dyarubbin** project won the 2024 IMAGinE Award for Engagement Programs in NSW Museums.




