






<u>Spendmapp</u>, developed by Geografia, is an economic modelling tool used by several local government areas to measure consumer spending of locals and visitors geographically using bank data.

The tool helps local council's and businesses gain a better understanding of the local economy by providing an insight into the visitor economy, online expenditure and escape expenditure. Using the data helps determine patterns of spending and can assist with managing and responding to long term economic trends and shocks.







June's visitor spending decreased in *Transport*, *Specialised Food Retailing*, *Grocery Stores & Supermarkets*, and *Dining & Entertainment* from the previous month. However, there was increased spending in *Specialised & Luxury Goods*.

This June, resident spending shows a decrease in all categories.

Food Safety Grower Guidelines

The Fresh Produce Safety Centre of Australia and New Zealand (FPSC) has recently developed 13 Food Safety Grower Guides to fill recognised gaps in industry resources for small growers. The guides provide key information and best practice guidance on food safety for fresh produce growers, from pre-harvest to post-harvest activities.


With the upcoming changes to regulations for leafy vegetables, berries and melons, these guides will also help growers adopt practices that will ensure compliance and help food businesses understand the risks associated with the food that they select. Hawkesbury food businesses should note the Severe Weather Events, Cleaning and Sanitising, and Temperature Management guides.

Vibrancy Reforms

In 2023, the NSW Government introduced a comprehensive package of reforms through the 24-Hour Economy Legislation Amendment (Vibrancy Reforms) Act 2023.

Most of these reforms commenced on 12 December 2023. However, several of the more complex reforms and those that involved significant systems changes and consultation with stakeholders prior to implementation commenced on 1 July 2024.

The reforms are part of the NSW Government's Vibrancy Reforms, which aim to encourage the return of music, live performance, local street life and a vibrant night-time economy that doesn't come at the expense of safety.

The key changes that came into effect from 1 July can be found here.





Liquor Licence Manager

The Liquor Licence Manager is a new digital product that aims to increase visibility and control over liquor licence applications and payments for licences and authorised third-party users.

This tool is designed to centralise liquor licences in a single location and provide greater visibility on the current status of a licence and conditions. It provides general information about a licence or premises.
